



With business momentum on the rise, Fujifilm Medical Systems USA has decided to take a major logistical step designed to even further advance our prospects for the long term: FMSU corporate headquarters will relocate to Lexington, Massachusetts in the spring of 2019, just prior to the expiration of our lease in Stamford, CT. Lexington, a suburb in Middlesex County that is 14 miles northwest of Boston, will provide an encouraging and stimulating environment for our corporate hub, as will the modern facility in which we will establish our new home.

FMSU is fully aware of the impact such a move can have on individual staff members and their families, particularly those who will be asked to relocate to the Lexington area. We therefore encourage all Stamford employees to meet with their managers to discuss specific circumstances. Please note that some may be reassigned to Fujifilm USA's office in Valhalla, NY, and others to our warehouse facility in Edison, NJ or our research facility in Morrisville, NC. A few may switch to remote status.

We are extremely excited about the impact that relocation to Lexington will have on numerous aspects of our business, from improved daily workflow and an enhanced corporate image, to new local synergies and an outstanding regional talent pool. In addition to a modern showroom and spacious training center, our new headquarters will convey the kind of innovation for which we are already known throughout the industry.

Also of great value will be our proximity to the progressive educational environments of Harvard University, MIT, and Northeastern University. Moreover, we will be located within a vibrant life-sciences business community that in Lexington alone includes Sekisui Diagnostics and the Shire biomedical company. GE Healthcare has a major corporate center in Marlborough, also in Middlesex County, and Olympus Surgical Technologies is headquartered in nearby Worcester County. Cambridge, located directly across the Charles River from Boston, is home to such healthcare companies as Biogen, Genzyme, and the Novartis Institutes for BioMedical Research.

For employees who will be affected by this move, Middlesex County is an appealing spot for relocation, as it offers unique options for leisure and culture and possesses many other qualities that can contribute to a vibrant family life. Often called "The Birthplace of American Liberty," Middlesex is home to many historical buildings from the Colonial and Revolutionary eras as well as several recreational spots, including the 900-acre Minute Man National Historical Park.

There will be plenty of opportunities for employees to explore the region, including FMSU-sponsored bus tours. More information on these tours, and on relocation packages, will be forthcoming shortly. Your HR representative also has some preliminary information that can be shared at this time.
